RODGERS & HAMMERSTEIN'S **THE SOUND OF MUSIC**

For forty-six years *The Sound of Music* has filled the hearts of theatre goers around the world. On May 5, 6, and 7, 2005, Tupelo Community Theatre audiences will once again enjoy the inspiring story and glorious melodies which have made Oscar Hammerstein's and Richard Rodgers' great Broadway musical a theatrical legend.

Based loosely on the true saga of the Trapp Family Singers, who escaped the German occupation of their Austrian homeland, TCT's production of *The Sound of Music* will feature a large cast of talented individuals from around northeast Mississippi. "I am thrilled that our cast features people from Okolona, Starkville, Oxford, Booneville, Shannon, Ripley, Fulton, Mantachie, as well as Tupelo," said director Sonja Jenkins. "This is truly regional theatre at its best."

Newcomer, Angela Hunt, Director of Music at Okolona First Baptist Church will star as Maria, the governess, who changes the lives of the Von Trapp Family. An Alabama native,

Angela received her bachelor's degree in vocal performance from the University of North Alabama and obtained her masters from the University of Mississippi. She appeared in leading roles in several university operas.

Wayne Williams, a Tupelo attorney and TCT veteran, takes on the role of Captain Georg Von Trapp, the distant and remote captain who is transformed by the love of Maria.

Dr. Jerri Lamar Kantack, Choral Music Director at Blue Mountain College and Pontotoc native, is making her debut at TCT in the role of Mother Abbess, who sings the show-stopping "Climb Every Mountain." The other principal nuns who will be sharing their distinctive talents are Sherrie Black as Sister Berthe, Brittany Bennett as Sister Margaretta, and Jackie Hawkins as Sister Sophia.

Taking on another great character

role in a TCT production is Jim Boyd as Max Detweiler, the impresario and friend of Captain Von Trapp. Dr. Boyd, a local radiologist, has been seen in recent years in a number of musicals including *Fiddler on the Roof*, *Guys & Dolls* and most notably as Daddy Warbucks in *Annie*.

Margaret Goussett is appearing as Baroness Elsa Von Schraeder and brings with her a resume of great TCT roles in other shows.

As far as the Von Trapp children, audiences will enjoy the engaging presences of seven very talented young people – Darby Kellum as Liesl; Kelly Lence as Louisa; Kyle Young as Friedrich; Austin Kinsey as Kurt; Kara Young as Brigitta; Kristy McNair as Marta, and Hannah Gunnells as Gretl. Jenkins stated that competition was fierce for these roles, "We auditioned over 100 children, all of whom were so talented. It was the most difficult casting experience I have ever encountered but I am pleased with the end result."

Rounding out the principal cast are newcomers Stephen Torrent as Franz

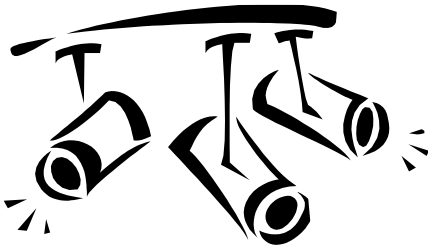

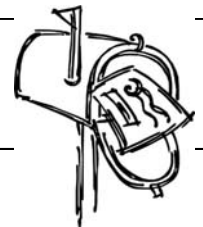

for this to be a regular, quarterly offering for a period of time to recruit the talent we know exists in our patron base.

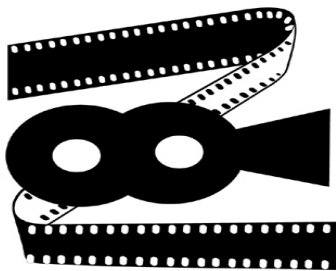
For those who want a more "physical" challenge, watch for our hands-on set construction summer workshops open to ALL levels of experience and building skill.
